1	AN ACT
2	To enact Chapter 1-A of Title 3 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950, to be comprised
3	of R.S. 3:41 through 47, relative to the regulation of unmanned aerial systems in
4	agricultural commercial operations; to provide for definitions; to authorize the
5	commissioner to adopt rules; to provide for license and registration requirements; to
6	provide relative to the operation of unmanned aerial systems; to provide for
7	violations; to authorize the commissioner to issue stop orders; to provide for
8	penalties; and to provide for related matters.
9	Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana:
10	Section 1. Chapter 1-A of Title 3 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950,
11	comprised of R.S. 3:41 through 47 is hereby enacted to read as follows:
12	CHAPTER 1-A. UNMANNED AERIAL SYSTEMS
13	<u>§41. Definitions</u>
14	For the purposes of this Chapter, the following definitions shall apply:
15	(1) "Agricultural commercial operation" means the use of any
16	agricultural facility or agricultural land for agricultural production or
17	agricultural processing and includes the production and processing of crops or
18	products, livestock or livestock products, farm-raised fish and fish products,
19	wood, timber or forest products, fowl and plants for breeding or sale, and
20	poultry or poultry products for commercial or industrial purposes.
21	"Agricultural commercial operation" also includes the use of farm machinery,
22	equipment, devices, chemicals, products for agricultural use, materials, and
23	structures designed for agricultural use and used in accordance with traditional

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1	<u>farm practices.</u>
2	(2) "Aircraft" means an unmanned aircraft operated as a part of an
3	unmanned aerial system.
4	(3) "Commissioner" means the Louisiana commissioner of agriculture
5	and forestry.
6	(4) "Data" means any information, pictures, images, samples, or other
7	such information obtained through an unmanned aerial system.
8	(5) "Department" means the Louisiana Department of Agriculture and
9	<u>Forestry.</u>
10	(6) "Unmanned aerial system" means an unmanned aircraft and all
11	associated support equipment, control station, data links, telemetry,
12	communications, and navigation equipment necessary to operate the unmanned
13	aircraft. Such system may include drones, remote-controlled aircraft,
14	unmanned aircraft, or any other such aircraft that is controlled autonomously
15	by computer or remote control from the ground.
16	§42. Powers of the commissioner
17	A. The commissioner shall adopt rules and regulations to implement the
18	provisions of this Chapter, including but not limited to rules and regulations
19	governing the registration of unmanned aerial systems used in the course of
20	agricultural commercial operations. All rules and regulations shall be adopted
21	in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
22	B. The commissioner shall administer and enforce the provisions of this
23	Chapter and the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to the provisions of
24	this Chapter.
25	C. The commissioner may appoint committees to advise on the
26	implementation of the provisions of this Chapter. The appointed committees
27	shall include public universities holding certificates of authorization from the
28	Federal Aviation Administration as well as other active university research
29	programs.
30	§43. Licenses and registration

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1	A. Each person operating an unmanned aerial system in the course of an
2	agricultural commercial operation shall obtain a license from the department,
3	which shall be issued upon the applicant meeting the following requirements:
4	(1) Applicants shall submit a written application to the department as
5	provided by the commissioner by rule.
6	(2) Prior to applying for a license, each applicant shall complete an
7	agricultural education and safety training course administered by the Louisiana
8	cooperative extension service and comply with any other licensing requirements
9	established by the commissioner by rule.
10	B. Each unmanned aerial system operated in the course of an
11	agricultural commercial operation shall be registered with the department.
12	C. Licenses and registrations shall be valid for three years and may be
13	renewed for additional three-year periods in accordance with rules adopted by
14	the commissioner.
15	§44. Unmanned aerial systems; operation
16	A. Unmanned aerial systems may operate in agricultural commercial

(3) Data obtained through the use of an unmanned aerial system shall be used solely in the course of conducting a generally accepted agricultural

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1	educational institution.
2	(4) All data obtained through the use of an unmanned aerial system shall
3	remain the property of the legal owner of the property where the data was
4	collected, unless written approval is given by the property owner for other uses.
5	Public universities conducting agricultural research may negotiate with the
6	legal owner of the property for the terms of use or shared ownership of the data.
7	§45. Violations
8	Violations of this Part shall include but shall not be limited to the
9	following:
10	(1) The failure or refusal to obtain an unmanned aerial system license in
11	accordance with R.S. 3:43.
12	(2) The failure or refusal to register an unmanned aerial system operated
13	in the course of an agricultural commercial operation in accordance with R.S.
14	<u>3:43.</u>
15	(3) Any violation of this Chapter or of any rule or regulation adopted
16	pursuant to the provisions of this Chapter.
17	(4) Any interference with the commissioner and the department or its
18	representatives in the performance of their duties as prescribed in this Chapter.
19	(5) Failure to timely pay any penalties or costs due pursuant to the
20	provisions of this Chapter or any rule or regulation of the commissioner
21	adopted pursuant to this Chapter.
22	<u>§46. Stop orders</u>
23	A. When the commissioner has reason to believe that a violation has
24	occurred, the commissioner may issue a stop order prohibiting the continued
25	use of an unmanned aerial system.
26	B. Any violation of a stop order shall constitute a separate violation.
27	C. A stop order may be released by the commissioner upon a
28	determination by the commissioner that the cause for issuing the stop order has
29	been remedied.
30	D. Any person aggrieved by a stop order may petition the commissioner

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1	for a hearing to contest the validity of the stop order by making a written
2	request within five calendar days after issuance of the stop order. The hearing
3	shall be held within ten calendar days of receipt of the written request for a
4	hearing. The commissioner may appoint a hearing officer to preside over the
5	matter. The commissioner shall issue a ruling in the matter. The hearing and
6	any subsequent appeal shall be held in accordance with the provisions of the
7	Administrative Procedure Act.
8	E. Based upon the results of the hearing, or a consent agreement, the
9	commissioner may take one or more of the following actions:
10	(1) Release the stop order.
11	(2) Require the cause for the stop order to be remedied prior to releasing
12	the stop order.
13	(3) Amend the stop order.
14	§47. Penalties
15	A. If the commissioner determines that a violation of the provisions of
16	this Chapter or of the rules and regulations adopted pursuant to the provisions
17	of this Chapter has occurred, an adjudicatory hearing shall be held to make a
18	determination with respect to the suspected violation.
19	B. The commissioner shall give written notice to the alleged violator,
20	which shall comply with the requirements of the Administrative Procedure Act,
21	at least five days prior to the date set for such adjudicatory hearing.
22	C. The commissioner shall designate a hearing officer to preside at all
23	adjudicatory proceedings.
24	D. At any such adjudicatory hearing, the alleged violator shall be
25	accorded all of the rights set forth in the Administrative Procedure Act.
26	E. Whenever the commissioner makes a determination from the
27	proceedings of the adjudicatory hearing that a violation of this Chapter or these
28	regulations has occurred, the commissioner may impose a civil penalty not to
29	exceed five hundred dollars for each violation. Civil penalties shall be imposed
30	only on the basis of an adjudication of violations pursuant to an adjudicatory

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1	hearing held in accordance with the Administrative Procedure Act.
2	F. Each separate day on which a violation occurs shall be considered a
3	separate violation.
4	Section 2. This Act shall become effective upon signature by the governor or, if not
5	signed by the governor, upon expiration of the time for bills to become law without signature
6	by the governor, as provided by Article III, Section 18 of the Constitution of Louisiana. If
7	vetoed by the governor and subsequently approved by the legislature, this Act shall become
8	effective on the day following such approval.
